Nehemiah 11-12

(We will read: 11:1-2; 12:27-47) Black Pew Bible pg. 406

<u>Keys to Reading:</u> The wall is finished and the people have recommitted themselves to live for the Lord. As they dedicate the wall, Nehemiah acts to repopulate the city.

<u>Main Idea:</u> Jerusalem as God's holy city is at the centre of His plan for the world. The people dedicate the finished wall, the temple, and themselves to the work of God.

<u>Theme:</u> God uses ordinary people to establish His Kingdom.

Reflection Questions:

- In what do you find joy?
- The people blessed those who chose to live in Jerusalem (11:2). What would it look like for you to 'volunteer to live in Jerusalem' in our own time/situation?
- How do you respond when you are asked to give up something for another's sake? What might your reaction reveal about your heart's attitude?

<u>Act!</u> Remember that God has chosen you and set you apart to serve Him. Though you may question your giftedness, know that God can use you to make an eternal difference in His Kingdom. Act boldly this week in the service of God; share an encouraging word, comfort someone in distress, speak about your hope in Jesus!
